

JUNIUS TOWN BOARD  
REGULAR MEETING JUNE 17, 2015  
JUNIUS TOWN HALL

ATTENDANCE: SUPERVISOR RONALD SERVEN. COUNCILMEMBERS C.ERNEST BROWNELL, ELAINE MEYERS, RICHARD WADHAMS. ATTORNEY FOR THE TOWN TONIGHT WAS JOSEPH MIDIRI.

ABSENT: COUNCILMEMBER TODD MERKLEY AND APPOINTED ATTORNEY FOR THE TOWN MICHAEL MIRRAS.

SPECIAL GUESTS: MELISSA TAYLOR AND BILL CLARK.

OPEN: SUPERVISOR SERVEN OPENED TONIGHT'S MEETING WITH THE PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AT 7:07P.M. MELISSA TAYLOR FROM THE OFFICE OF EMERGENCY SERVICES OF SENECA COUNTY ALONG WITH MR. CLARK SPOKE BRIEFLY ABOUT 2015 MULTI-JURISDICTION HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN UPDATE. THERE IS MONEY AVAILABLE THROUGH FEMA IF THE TOWN QUALIFIES. THERE WAS A BRIEF DISCUSSION WITH SOME QUESTIONS REGARDING GETTING THE FUNDING AND HOW TO IDENTIFY PROJECTS.

MS.GRASS ADDRESSED THE BOARD REGARDING GETTING THE DEBT SERVICE ON HER PARENTS PROPERTY. COUNCILMEMBER ELAINE MEYERS MOTION TO REMOVE THE DEBT SERVICE FROM 1429 GASSNER ROAD WATERLOO FROM THE TAXES EFFECTIVE NEXT YEAR. COUNCILMEMBER WADHAMS SECONDED THE MOTION WHICH CARRIED WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVOR.

TAX COLLECTOR LINDA CORDOVANI ADDRESSED THE BOARD ABOUT THE ISSUE TO ABOLISH THE POSITION OF TAX COLLECTOR. THE BOARD ASSURED HER THAT HER QUALITY OF WORK HAS NEVER BEEN AN ISSUED. THE TOWN CLERK ALSO READ A SUPPORT LETTER FROM DORIS EDWARD IN FAVOR OF KEEPING THE POSTION. THE ATTORNEY SPOKE ABOUT A COUPLE OF WAYS TO DO ABOLISH THE POSITION IF THE BOARD WANTED TO. NO ACTION AT THIS TIME.

TOWN CLERK: COUNCILMEMBER BROWNELL MOTION TO ACCEPT THE TOWN CLERKS MINUTES AND WITH COUNCILMEMBER MEYERS MAKING THE SECOND THE MOTION CARRY WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVOR. AT THIS TIME THE CLERK READ HER REPORT SHOWING A TOTAL DISBURSEMENT OF \$123.00 AND THE TOWN SHARE WAS \$105.00. COUNCILMEMBER MEYERS MADE THE MOTION TO ACCEPT THE REPORT AND WITH COUNCILMEMBER WADHAMS MAKING THE SECOND THE MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVOR.

WATER: TOTAL OUTSTANDING FOR THE MONTHS OF JANUARY, FEBRUARY AND MARCH IN DISTRICT1 WAS \$1,623.25 AND IN DISTRICT 2 IT WAS \$852.50. COUNCILMEMBER WADHAMS MOTION TO ACCEPT THE REPORT AND WITH COUNCILMEMBER BROWNELL MAKING THE SECOND THE MOTION PASSED WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVOR.SUPERVISOR SERVEN SPOKE BRIEFLY REGARDING POSSIBLE GRANT MONEY FOR THE WATER DEVELOPMENT. HE DID SEND IN THE APPLICATION.

SEWER: THE LIMITS WERE GOOD FOR THE FIRST HALF OF MAY. THEY HAVEN'T RECEIVED THE RESULTS ON THE REST OF THE MONTH. COUNCILMAN BROWNELL MADE THE MOTION TO ACCEPT AND COUNCILWOMAN MEYERS MADE THE SECOND WHICH CARRIED WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVOR.

HIGHWAY: THE DOG KENNEL IS COMPLETED. THEY REBUILT THE MOWER MAIN FRAME WHICH WAS CRACKED AND BENT. THE FIGURES FOR THE 2016 F350 XLREGULAR CAB FROM VANBORTLE IS

\$29,978.20 WHICH IS ABOUT \$4,000.00 MORE THAN WHAT WAS ORIGINALLY DISCUSSED. THE SUPERINTENDANT SPOKE BRIEFLY ABOUT THE NATURAL GAS SERVICE ON ROUTE 318 AND THE POSSIBILITY IT JUST WON'T HANDLE ANY MORE LARGE CONSTRUCTION, RICELLI'S HAD A PROBLEM AND THEY DECIDED TO GO WITH DIESEL. COUNCILMAN WADHAMS MADE THE MOTION TO ACCEPT THE REPORT AND WITH COUNCILMAN BROWNELL MADE THE SECOND, WHICH CARRIED WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVOR.

BUILDING/DCO: NO REPORT ON THE BUILDING OTHER THAN THEY ARE STILL WORKING ON THE HIGHWAY BARN. THE DCO REPORTED THE KENNEL IS UP. MOTION TO ACCEPT BOTH REPORTS CAME FROM COUNCILMEMBER MEYERS AND SECONDED BY COUNCILMAN WADHAMS. THE MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVOR.

ASSESSOR: GRIEVANCE DAY WAS HELD ON JUNE 3, 2015. THERE WERE 3 COMPLAINTS FILED BY VERIZON. THE FINAL ASSESSMENT ROLL WILL BE FILED IN THE CLERKS OFFICE ON JULY 1. COUNCILPERSON BROWNELL MADE THE MOTION TO ACCEPT THE REPORT AND WITH COUNCILPERSON WADHAMS MAKING THE SECOND THE MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL IN FAVOR.

OLD/NEW BUSINESS: COUNCILMEMBER MEYERS MOTION TO HAVE A STIPEN OF \$25.00 FOR THE HIGHWAY DEPARTMENT EMPLOYEES CELL PHONES AND HAVE THE TOWN PLANS CANCELLED EFFECTIVE TENTATIVELY BY AUGUST. COUNCILPERSON WADHAMS SECONDED HER MOTION WHICH PASSED WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVOR. AT THIS TIME COUNCILMAN WADHAMS MOTIONED TO HAVE THE TAX COLLECTOR POSITION ABOLISHED TO BE PUT ON THE BALLOT IN THIS UPCOMING ELECTION. COUNCILWOMAN MEYERS MADE THE SECOND WHICH ALL MEMBERS WERE IN FAVOR.

BILLS: GENERAL FUND V#119-145 FOR \$36,401.89 WAS MOTION BY COUNCILMEMBER BROWNELL AND THE SECOND CAME FROM COUNCILMEMBER WADHAMS, WHICH CARRIED WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVOR.

HIGHWAY: V#34-47 FOR \$10,931.46 WAS MOTIONED TO PAY BY COUNCILMAN WADHAMS AND THE SECOND CAME FROM COUNCILMAN BROWNELL, WHICH CARRIED WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVOR.

WATER1: V#39-44 FOR \$13,828.32 WAS MOTION TO PAY BY COUNCILMAN WADHAMS AND WITH COUNCILWOMAN MEYERS MAKING THE SECOND, THE MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVOR.

WATER2: V#12-14 FOR \$2,208.53 WAS MOTION BY COUNCILMAN BROWNELL AND THE SECOND CAME FROM COUNCILMAN WADHAMS, WHICH CARRIED WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVOR.

SEWER: V#60-70 FOR \$9,879.51 WAS MOTION TO PAY BY COUNCILWOMAN MEYERS AND WITH COUNCILMAN BROWNELL MAKING THE SECOND THE MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVOR.

ADJOURNMENT: COUNCILMAN WADHAMS MADE THE MOTION TO ADJOURN THE MEETING AT 9:00 AND WITH COUNCILWOMAN MEYERS MAKING THE SECOND, THE MOTION CARRIED WITH ALL MEMBERS IN FAVORED AND THER MEETING WAS ADJORNED.
